The big picture

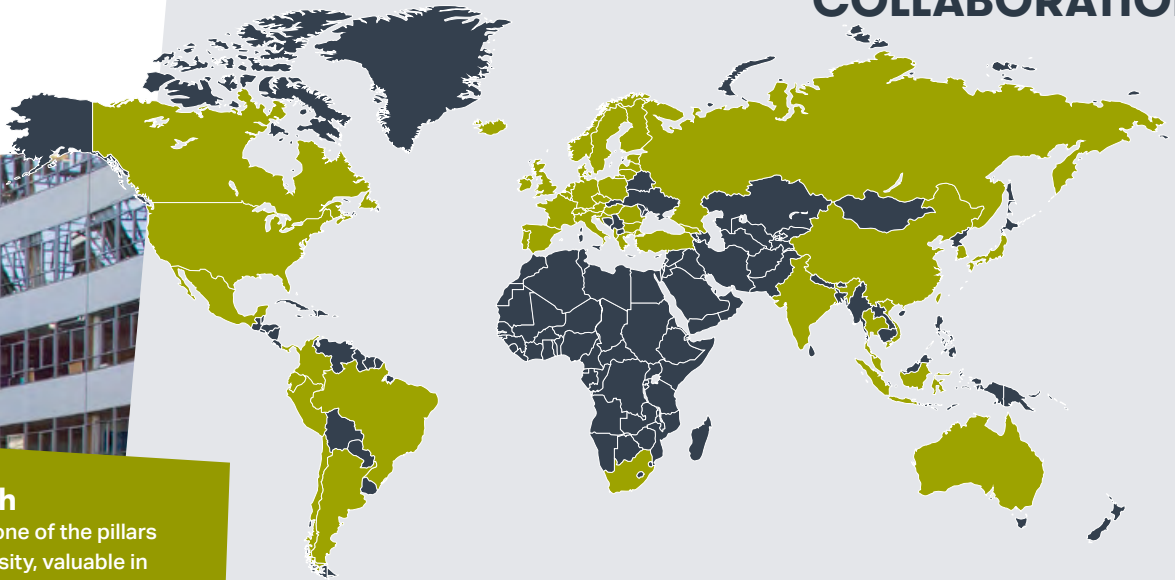
As you pursue your degree, you'll gain hands-on experience from work placements at organisations in the public or private sector. This gives you the experience to put what you've learned into practice.

All our courses have a strong international emphasis with opportunities for placements in The Hague, the Netherlands, Europe and overseas. You can tap into THUAS's extensive alumni network and travel to countries like Japan, Argentina and the United States, if permitted.

Research

Making connections

During your time at THUAS, you'll be able to make connections with public- and private-sector organisations and to build valuable professional networks in your field of study. To promote economic and social development and to give you as many opportunities as possible, we work together with other academic institutions, businesses, governments and social organisations. These in turn generate internships, projects, labs, research and more. You have the option to work on local, regional, national or international levels.

A few examples of regional and national partnerships:

- In both education and research, we have developed numerous projects with the municipalities of The Hague, Delft and Zoetermeer, among others.
- At the regional level, we cooperate with organisations such as the Economic Board of South Holland, which brings together businesses, governments and knowledge institutions.
- We have also established partnerships with the ROC Mondriaan, Leiden University and other universities of applied sciences.
- We work with organisations such as the Netherlands Organisation for Applied Scientific Research (TNO), Haga Hospital and NGOs in The Hague region.

About International partnerships

As a networking university of applied sciences, our priority is to create new synergies and opportunities that accentuate the quality of our education and research. To do this, we've built strong international partnerships with academic institutions outside of Holland, such as Tampere University in Finland, Beijing Foreign Studies University in China and Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais in Brazil. Through these bilateral partnerships, you'll be able to take advantage of student and staff exchanges and share research findings and other knowledge with peers at international institutions. All with the goal of having a positive impact on the world we live in.

The difference between a university of applied sciences and a research university

There are two types of universities in the Netherlands - traditional research universities (WO) and universities of applied sciences (HBO). Both offer bachelor's and master's programmes, but vary in their teaching methods.

HBO universities, like THUAS, put the emphasis on practical tuition and focus on your future career. You'll learn by working on 'real life' projects in close cooperation with the outside world.

At a HBO university such as THUAS, you will do a compulsory internship or work placement to apply the theory you have learned into practice.

We focus on training and career preparation and work closely with professionals to make sure that our programmes are cutting edge and industry relevant. Businesses and institutions help design our curricula, which means they are hands-on, solution based and market ready. Our lecturers are working professionals, who'll give you first-hand insight into their field.

WO universities tend to run more theory and research-based courses and students attend larger lectures and work independently. HBOs have a more personal approach with smaller classes.

Please note: A THUAS bachelor will not necessarily qualify you for a master at a WO university in the Netherlands - you may need to take additional courses.

At THUAS we offer 45 full-time bachelor's programmes, 11 of which are taught fully in English. Our bachelor's programmes normally take four years to complete. However, some of our programmes can be completed in three years. Please see the admissions requirements to find out which programmes you are eligible for.

All students go on an internship for one semester (half the academic year). The particular arrangements can vary in structure and can entail research or a more practical focus.

At THUAS, all of our bachelor's degrees are based on practical approaches and have an international dimension. Naturally, they also focus on your personal academic and professional development. You'll learn, according to your own style, through a combination of lectures, small seminars, tutorials, self-guided study and individual assignments and exams. You'll round it all off with your thesis.

European Studies (ES-4)

European Studies is an interdisciplinary study programme that empowers young professionals to pro-actively resolve the challenges facing organisations, businesses, and institutions in Europe today. Instead of focusing on a specific job, ES combines knowledge of Europe, professional skills and foreign languages to equip students for different careers in which they assist Europe's public and private sector organisations by giving policy advice (on government regulations, public affairs or sustainability), doing public relations, marketing or communications, engaging in fundraising or international trade. Master's Degrees in public policy, international relations or business are also an option, so if you want a career in Europe and you like business and politics – or don't know which you prefer – and you have a feeling for culture and languages, ES might be right for you.

European Studies 3 (Accelerated fast-track) (ES3)

This fast-track version of our interdisciplinary Bachelor of Arts in European Studies takes students through Europe's public policy and businesses processes at high speed to help them prepare for a career at a European institution, organisation or business in policy advice, public affairs, marketing and communication or international trade, or for a master's degree in a related field (Public Administration, International Relations, International Business, etc.). It's a more intensive and challenging programme because it essentially combines the first and second year of the four-year European Studies bachelor into one foundation year and pushes students to develop themselves more independently and at a faster pace, while still including intensive foreign language learning and key professional skills. If you like politics and business – or don't know which you prefer – and you're up to the challenge, ES3 may be the right choice for you.

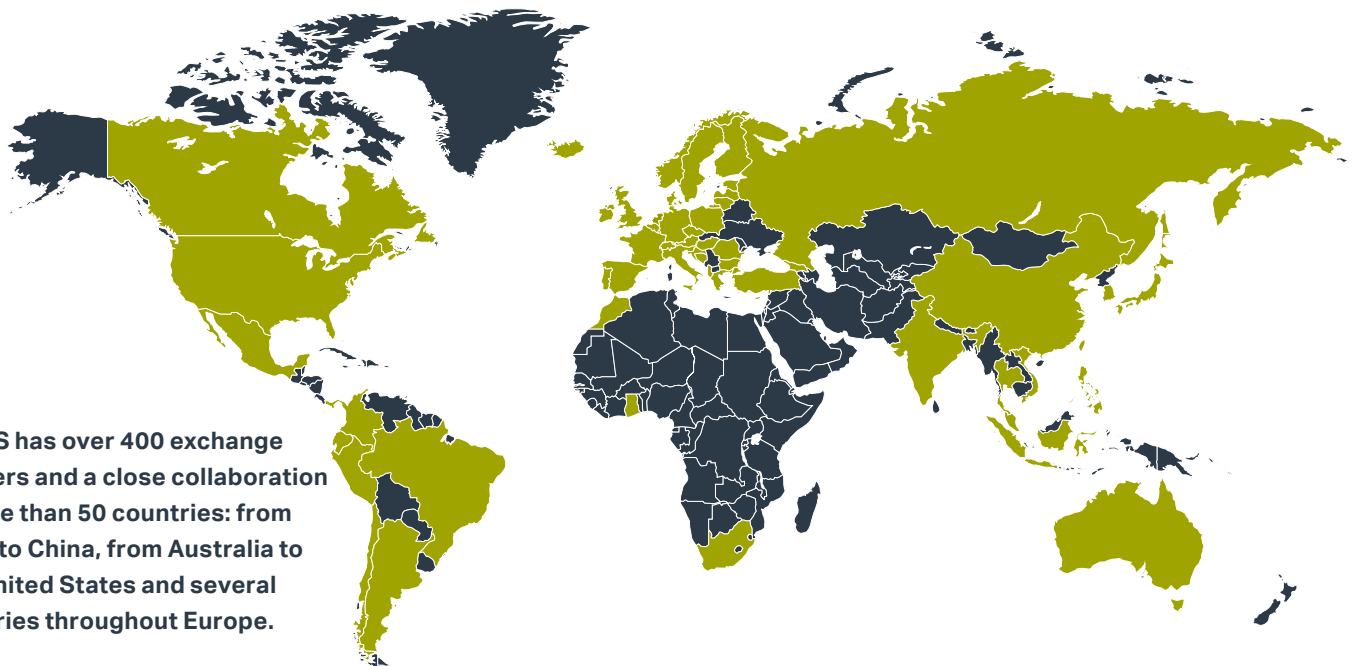

Admission requirements

Applying for bachelor's programmes

You'll need the equivalent of a Dutch HAVO or VWO diploma to apply for our bachelor's programmes. If you hold a non-Dutch diploma, your eligibility will be assessed against Nuffic guidelines (www.nuffic.nl).

Once you have filled out the relevant forms and applied, it's time to sit tight and wait while the admissions committee consider your application. This process can take several weeks.

If you're educated in the Netherlands, UK, Ireland, USA, Canada (except Quebec), Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Malta, or hold a diploma (including English as an exam subject) listed at www.thehagueuniversity.nl/enrolment, you don't need to take an English proficiency test.

If you are applying for a master's programme and have completed an English-taught bachelor's programme, you may also be exempt from an English proficiency test.

All other applicants are required to have a valid and sufficient English proficiency test.

Applying for the English Academic Preparation programme

If you don't have the proficiency in English that you need in order to enrol on your chosen programme, you can apply for the English Academic Preparation programme, or Prep School, which takes six months or one year. On completion of this course, you'll be ready to join a bachelors programme and will have a working knowledge of The Netherlands, The Hague and THUAS under your belt.

To be admitted to Prep School, you need to be eligible for the programme you wish to take after completing the course and have an IELTS or TOEFL test result with sufficient score.

Applying for The Hague Summer School

The Hague Summer School is open to anyone who has completed a first year bachelor's degree, or already has a bachelors degree. So both undergraduate and graduate students are welcome to apply. You should have a good working knowledge of the English language (level B2 or higher) before you apply.

The last entry criteria to The Hague Summer School is your ambition. When you apply, 'motivation' is one of the most important parts of the selection process.

Scholarships and finances

EU/EEA and non-EU/EEA students pay tuition fees for bachelor's and master's programmes. So it's time to do the maths and explore the loans, grants and scholarships that may be available to finance your studies at THUAS.

Bachelor's and master's programmes


EU/EEA bachelor's students pay €2,209 per year and most non-EU/EEA pay €8,634. Tuition fees vary between €19,700 and €21,999 for a masters.

Other Programmes

The Hague Summer School has a one-off fee which covers all of your main costs including tuition, accommodation, lunches and coffee breaks on class days, study materials and in-programme cultural visits and social activities.

The four-week course costs €3,045 (shared room)/€3,175 (single room) and the two-week course costs €1,795 (shared room)/€1,895 (single room), but discounts may apply. Prep School costs €5,300 for the half-year and €9,000 for the full year course. Please note that these were the fees for the 2022 programme. Please check the link below for our current fees.

Scholarships

Monthly expenses

You'll also need to take your monthly expenses on accommodation, food and living into account and budget for your time at THUAS.

Experience has shown that students living in the Netherlands for one year spend between €800 and €1,100 a month.

An average room in the Netherlands costs somewhere between €400 and €700 a month. The costs depend on the type of room you have, what is included in the rent, if the room is furnished, if you will have to share your room (or the facilities) and the size of the room. Don't forget to budget about €650 per year for medical insurance. Bachelors first year students will also need to invest from €500 to €800 on books and materials.

To give you some approximate figures, bread and rice cost around €1.50 at the supermarket. A return train ticket from The Hague to Amsterdam costs around €24.40.

Visas and permits

EU and EEA students don't need a visa to enter the Netherlands. All other students in general require an entry visa and/or residence permit.



If you do require a visa or residence permit, the good news is that THUAS will apply on your behalf. All you have to do is transfer a package fee and upload the relevant documents. More information about the procedure and documentation will be provided after acceptance.

Accommodation

Looking for a place to live in The Hague or one of its satellite cities can be a challenging experience, so it pays to start house hunting early. Especially for students it can be challenging to find a place to live. Therefore, THUAS reserved a number of rooms at our accommodation partners for international students.

If you pay the THUAS housing service fee, you can make use of the accommodation that is already reserved through the university. The number of rooms is limited and are allocated on a first paid first serve base. Having a legitimate address is a prerequisite for obtaining a residence permit.

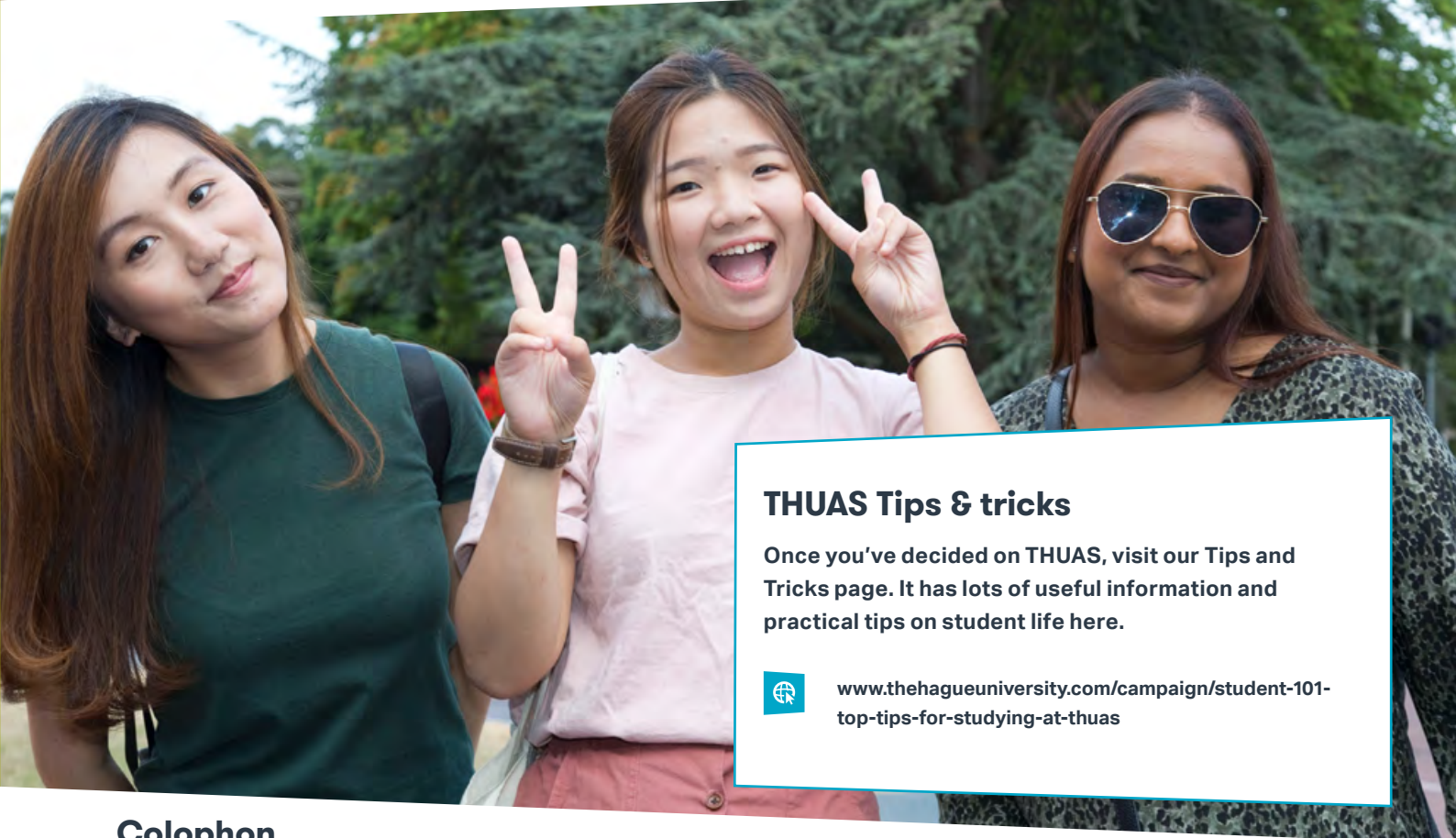
